

2017 Scholarship Applicant Requirements

1. Applicant must complete and submit via email the Michigan Aviation Scholarship Application, including supporting documentation, to miaviationscholarships@gmail.com by April 9, 2017.
2. Applicants pursuing a degree in flight science or aviation management must have college sophomore, junior or senior status by the Fall, 2017 Semester and be enrolled in an accredited aviation program (or graduated after 2014). Applicants pursuing maintenance certifications must be enrolled in an accredited aviation maintenance school of technology, with plans to complete a curriculum leading to a degree and a career in aviation.
3. Applicant must have maintained a 3.0 minimum GPA (on a 4.0 system) at the time of application.
4. Supporting documentation must be included with the application, including:
 - a. A current resume
 - b. Proof of U.S. Citizenship
 - c. School transcripts including GPA; official transcripts may be requested at a later date
 - d. A one page essay describing the applicant's aviation background, current status, and future aviation goals.
 - e. Photocopies of all FAA rating/certificates held
5. Final applicants enrolled in a flight science or aviation management curriculum must be available to attend a formal interview at the Amway Hangar in Grand Rapids on April 21, 2017. Final applicants enrolled in a maintenance curriculum may or may not be interviewed on April 21st, but will be informed in advance of a scheduled interview location and time.
6. Recipients must be available to accept their award in person at one of the awards ceremonies scheduled for either June 2nd or July 18th 2017.
7. Training scholarship recipients should aim to complete their awarded training within 12 months of receiving the scholarship.

FLIGHT TRAINING AWARDS

Two (2) Flight Safety International (FSI) Co-Pilot Initial Training Courses including a cash stipend to help offset travel expenses. In addition, recipient will receive ATP certification in a separate course.

- **Course Description:** This is an aircraft specific pilot training course held at a designated Flight Safety Learning Center.
- **Qualifications:** Applicant must hold Senior status by the Fall, 2017 Semester or be a 2014-2017 graduate currently employed within the aviation field and have earned a Commercial Multi-Engine Rating. Applicant must also have amassed flight hours that are within 500 of those required to be eligible for ATP certification.

MAINTENANCE/AVIONICS TRAINING AWARDS

One (1) CAE SimuFlite King Air 300 Initial Maintenance Training Course including a cash stipend to help offset travel expenses.

- **Course Description:** This is a 12-day aircraft specific maintenance training course held in Dallas, TX.

Two (2) Flight Safety International (FSI) eLearning Maintenance Training Courses

- **Course Description:** Select from a number of online maintenance training courses including Principles of Troubleshooting which is taught online with a live instructor.
Duration: 20 hours – 4 days at 5 hours per day

Engine Maintenance Training Awards – Two (2) Williams International Engine Training Courses

- **Course Description:** This is a five day Line Maintenance Training Course conducted at the Williams International Training Center in Walled Lake, MI.

Avionics Training Awards – Two (2) Rockwell Collins Pro Line 4 or 21 CBT Courses

- **Course Description:** Select from a variety of courses offered to pilots or mechanics in support of the functionality of the Pro Line 4 or 21 avionics.

Qualifications for all Maintenance and Avionics Training Awards: Applicant must be currently enrolled in a college/university maintenance program or an accredited technical training school with a minimum one year tenure in the program.

CASH AWARDS
